



CITY OF CALGARY FUNDING BRINGS US ONE STEP CLOSER TO THE CENTRE OF ALL ABILITIES

In 2022 we were pleased to announce that Vecova has been approved to receive \$9.095 million towards our new Centre for All Abilities under the Major Partners Capital Program with the City of Calgary.

The current Vecova facility has been deemed to be at the end of its life cycle based on assessment studies conducted between 2016 and 2022. Approximately 30% of the building has already been closed due to its poor condition and is no longer being used to deliver services to Calgarians.

This funding brings us one step closer to our dream of creating Vecova's Centre for All Abilities, which is expected to accommodate up to one million visitors per year. The new facility will have a social return on investment (SROI) of \$6.39 for every \$1 invested, compared to the current facility which generates \$2.34 per dollar invested.

We appreciate this support from the city council and Mayor Jyoti Gondek!

PROGRESSING OUR 12TH AVENUE ACCESSIBLE HOUSING PROJECT

Thanks to seed funding from Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation's (CMHC) received in fall 2022, we have been exploring the redevelopment of Vecova's 12th Avenue SE group living. The house has been home to Vecova residents living with disabilities since 1983.

We saw an opportunity with this property to serve more people in need of accessible and affordable housing. We worked with GEC Architecture to design a new home that follows a universal design approach, ensuring the fundamental needs of persons with disabilities are adequately met.

The new development will more than triple residential capacity, offering a safe, comfortable and accessible space for up to 17 residents across 13 units. It will make a significant impact on the current market gap for affordable and accessible homes for those living with a disability.

In March 2023 we became one step closer to providing this brand-new, 100% accessible, state-of-theart housing facility to Calgarians with the announcement of \$1.9M in funding from Alberta's Affordable Housing Partnership Program.

We thank the Government of Canada and the City of Calgary for recognizing the need to address this gap in the housing market, and for partnering with Vecova to help fill it. We look forward to securing additional funding as soon as possible so we can get started on construction with an estimated completion time frame of 18 months.

This opportunity to build our dream home will help us achieve our Vision of inclusion for everyone, enabling Calgarians of all abilities to move forward together.

BUILDING A CULTURE

OF ENGAGEMENT AND BELONGING

We've been focused on moving forward together by creating an organizational culture where employees feel a true sense of belonging, appreciation and engagement. We started our internal culture transformation in Spring 2022 with a three-phased approach.

PHASE 1: ASSESS (COMPLETE)

Phase one focused on gathering input from the experts: our employees. Through an organization-wide survey and a design group process with a cross representation of Vecova's diverse workforce, the assessment results informed the creation of a new cultural framework with measurable milestones to be achieved over the next six to 24 months.

This framework maps out the desired future state of engagement and belonging with core activities under each of the three pillars – connection, communication and culture.



PHASE 2: IMPLEMENT (IN PROGRESS)

We are currently implementing strategies under these pillars that will bring the framework's core activities to life and track our key milestones. Some of these strategies include the creation of an employee social committee and adjustments to our standard meeting structures that will improve information sharing and communication between leaders and employees. We continue to explore and implement new strategies that will help us achieve our desired future state.

PHASE 3 - MEASURE AND SUSTAIN (IN PROGRESS)

This work will focus on reviewing the results of strategies implemented in Phase 2 and seeking ways to strengthen our culture of engagement and belonging. There will be an overlap between Phases 2 and 3; it will involve benchmarking success indicators and measuring for impact.

We are committed to embodying belonging at the centre of all we do while focusing on employee engagement and investing in our workforce. This is just the beginning of Vecova's continuous journey to create and sustain an internal culture focused on engagement and belonging.

In 2022 we've been reflecting on Vecova's history to ground ourselves in the values it takes to move forward towards all the possibilities our future has to offer.

Vecova's success can be traced back to the unwavering determination and passion of one mother, Christine Meikle. In the 1950s her son was born with Down Syndrome and despite being told that he was unteachable and should be placed in an institution, she refused to accept this as the only option. Along with other parents who were seeking resources and services for their children with disabilities, the group came together to create what grew into Vecova - a place where people of all abilities can receive the support they need in order to thrive.

Moving forward, *together.* That's what "Vecova" means - and since our inception in 1964, that has been our goal. What started as a then-revolutionary call for basic rights and vocational training for people of all abilities, has grown over the past 50 years into one of the country's premier organizations providing programming and services for people with disabilities.

Vecova currently welcomes more than 390,000 visitors per year, and we're determined to make an even bigger impact with a new **Centre for All Abilities**. The demand for disability services has increased by 31% over the past decade, leaving many individuals and their families on waitlists for much-needed support. The need for Vecova's services continues to grow, and we're committed to filling that need.

Like our founder, we are passionate, bold and determined in our Mission to build a future for people of all abilities where everyone is valued, belongs and thrives. We're committed to continuing Christine's legacy by building a future for Vecova where everyone is valued, belongs and thrives.
